

Walk No.4

A "FIGURE OF EIGHT" WALK FROM KINGSTON CHURCH (about 3½ miles)

The walk starts at the double wooden gates of St Giles' churchyard, Kingston in Church Lane. With your back to the gates TL and round bend downhill to The Street. TL for about 100 yards and then TR (CB274) along bridleway between bungalows and follow about ¼M to hedge corner and single metal gate. TL along rough ground (with hedge on R) for a few yards and then cross field diagonally half L (CB275) to old railway embankment. Up steps to top and straight over and down steps to other side. Proceed half L across field and over 2 stiles and along short grassed track beside bungalow on L to The Street.

TR and immediately L along bridleway (CB273) through 2 gates and descend between fields to Coyet Lane. Cross over and into woods opposite and straight up wide bridleway (CB273). At top continue straight ahead along bridleway between 2 fields to cinder track (CB232). TR and where paths converge near Heart's Delight keep R and soon keep R again ascending wide cinder track. After about 200 yards keep R (CB276B) and follow up through gate, past blue way marker, then descend through woods to gate into fields. (Fine views across valley).

Continue down with first trees then fence on R and at R angle in fence at yellow way marker bear half L steeply down to stile in hedge (CB277). Cross Coyet Lane half L and up steps in bank, over stile and keeping woods (with steep drop) on L proceed to another stile and then up side of field, through gate to Marley Lane.

Cross lane and ascend steep lane (Jesse's Hill) to T junction. TR and follow tarmac lane down and eventually into Kingston (village sign on your L at 3-way junction). Continue down The Street and TR at gate into playing field, opposite No 46, Railway Cottage. (Inside the gate on R see large map of local definitive rights of way). Cross playing field half L (CB270) to gap in hedge, pass churchyard on L and back to starting point at double wooden gates.

KEY – TR = Turn Right TL = Turn Left
